Term Paper

Due Monday December 12th (Day of Final Exam)

Roughly 3-4 pages double spaced. Times New Roman. (Remember, length is only important if you need to fit more content into your essay). You must present a *thesis* (more on that below). You must also present a secondary source from outside of the class readings and lectures. If you plagiarize, copy, or otherwise fail to acknowledge the work of others in your paper, you will automatically fail.

- 1. Your paper must have a *Thesis*. That is, a statement of intent. Just start your paper off by telling me what you are going to do!
- 2. You must explain the purpose of Trolley Problems. What are Trolley Problems designed to do?
 - a. Explain the first Trolley Problem.
 - b. Are there any variations of the Trolley Problem (The surgeon, the doctor?) which you feel are important to bring up?
- 3. You must explain one of the following theories of Ethics and use it to provide an answer for how we should deal with Trolley Problems:
 - a. Mill's Theory of Utility
 - b. Kant's Deontology
 - c. Rawls' Theory of Justice (Egalitarianism)
- 4. You must include one secondary source and provide a full MLA works cited page. Ideally, your secondary source will include something about Trolley Problems (or other difficult decisions).
- 5. I highly recommend you meet with me to discuss your paper. I would be willing to look at a draft!

Thesis Example:

In this essay, I will explain how Kant's theory of Deontology helps us to make a "good" decision when faced with Trolley type problems. To do this, I will first explain what a Trolley Problem is. Next, I will explain Kant's theory of Deontology and provide answers to some counter arguments against his theory. Finally, I will show why Kant's theory is the best way to approach Trolley problems.
